### Ash Class Homework Menu

This term, we continue to set project homework alongside the Maths or English set each week. This menu details a range of fun activities including Oracy activities that can be completed at home to extend your child's learning. Please help your child to choose and complete a selection of these activities. To fit in with your family life, they can be completed after school, at weekends or as a half-term project. If you would like further suggestions, please feel free to select from the homework menus of other classes which are all available on the school website. Children are asked to share at least one of the activities with us in school. **The deadline for this homework is Wednesday 12<sup>th</sup> June** and we ask that the homework is not brought into class until after half-term.

### English

Draw or write a story about a very hungry insect or animal. What different foods would it eat? Can you describe them?

Our first story is about a caterpillar who turns into a butterfly. Can you find some facts about caterpillars or butterflies and share them with the class?

Which season is your favourite? Explain why to someone else. Can you persuade them that your season is the best?

## Science.

Can you plant seeds at home (in a garden or outside) and see what happens? How can you help them to grow?

Visit a beautiful garden with your family and draw and describe it.

Repurpose something that you have finished with to make something else.

## Art & DT

Create your own African Art artwork – what features will it need to have and what materials will you need?

Draw a careful observational drawing of a plant, flower or tree you have seen.

Create a piece of safari equipment such as binoculars.



# Let's go on Safari!

## History & Geography

Create the Kenya flag using different materials e.g. paint, Lego, collage.

Choose a safari animal and find some facts about it – can you tell us your facts?

Can you design your own African mask? You can do this on paper or you could make a 3D mask using cardboard and other junk materials from around your house.

Make a list of all the things you would need to go on a safari – you can draw and write your ideas down.

## Mathematics

Draw your own map of a safari park and use positional language to describe where each animal is on it.

Can you make or bake something using scales to weigh out the ingredients?

Y1: Count in 5s. Recall number bonds to 10 and then 20. Find fractions of shapes and amounts using Lego or buttons or fruit.

EYFS: learn number bonds to 5 and then 10, practise counting forwards and backwards up to 30.

### RE

Draw something that is precious to you. Can you explain why it is special to you?

Can you explain to someone how Pentecost is celebrated in church?

Design your own stained glass window to tell a parable that you have been told.
