Spring 2021

Collective Worship

Remote learning began a short notice in January but our daily Collective Worship continued seamlessly. We continued our 'new normal' broadcast for collective worship through TEAMs on the same daily basis. The pupils in school and at home have continued to participate throughout our sessions using the chat and, hands up function and sharing by unmuting themselves to share thoughts. Some have offered to read and share prayers. Rev. Felicity visits us remotely once a week to share with us and the children engage well with the message she brings. Each week we share a Bible story that links to our weekly theme. This half term we have learnt about Peace and Creativity linked to our school values. Mrs Wright, our RE leader uses the lectionary reading for the week in an engaging way and we have used many pre-recorded Genr8 assemblies too. Our best attended Collective Worships are the Head Teachers celebration assembly where we celebrate birthdays, achievements and link these successes to our values.

Our pupils continue to regularly share their thoughts on Collective Worship through pupil voice. Staff are routinely involved in observing and improving Collective worship as an ongoing self-improvement process. Governors are invited to attend Collective Worship remotely and feedback.

In the Spring 1 half term we have focused on the following each week:

Week 1 – This week we are learning finding out about what peace means to us and Christians. We look at the story of Abigail and Nabal from the Bible along with the Tax Collector story. We also learn our school memory verse about peace.

Week 2 - We continue our theme of Peace by looking at the story from the Bible all about Abram and Lot.

Week 3 – This week we explore what peace means to us in class, our school, at home and in the community.

Week 4 - We finish our theme of peace by looking at how CW Lewis as a Christian used stories to show peace.

Week 5 – We begin our new theme of creation and what that means to us in our work and learning. We also learn our school memory verse about creation.

Week 6 – We continue our theme of Creation and learn of the creation story in the Bible. We also explore the idea of generosity as a creative way of giving.

Our pupils continue to regularly share their thoughts on Collective Worship through pupil voice. Staff are routinely involved in observing and improving Collective worship as an ongoing self-improvement process. Governors are invited to attend Collective Worship remotely and feedback.

Religious Education

His brother asked,

Despite lockdown and remote learning, we still prioritised a half day across the school as planned to continue our Understanding Christianity topic. This half term we explored the theme of 'God'. We explored the parable of 'The lost son' from Luke's gospel. Children engaged well through a live lesson with their class teacher and all were set a follow up task at home. Children were asked to think about forgiveness and what this story tells us about what Christians believe about God's character. Why not have a look at a pre-recorded lesson from Mrs Wright, our RE leader. Many children watched this at home to help them understand the story and its message in more detail.

School leaders and our RE leader have met virtually with other schools to share great ideas about how to make virtual Collective Worship even better. We also work as an extended team with Barrington Primary C of E School and Rev. Felicity to share planning for Collective Worship and support each other in the planning and teaching Biblical values. We plan to have our first joint remote Collective Worship during Lent.
