This pack has been designed to support your child with preparing to move up to their new year group in September. The activities included have been selected to encourage children to practise and develop a range of English skills in fun and motivating ways.

We suggest that you spread the activities out over the summer holidays, completing a variety of tasks each week. However, you may choose to use them in a different way to suit the needs of your family. Some children (particularly younger ones) may need parts of the pack read to them to help them get started.




Guess Who?






















For example: my animal has brightly coloured feathers and a pointy beak. What is it?



The Number Plate Game

Look at the car registration plates below. Pay close attention to the last three letters displayed on each plate. Can you come up with a funny phrase starting with each of the letters shown?

Some examples:

AD02 AVD - A Vicious Dog. T11 LPM - Let's Play Marbles. AE06 YLE- You Love Elephants.

'I Went to the Shops...' Game




This is a game for two or more players. You need to imagine you're going shopping. What items would you put in your shopping trolley?

Player 1 begins by saying, 'I went to the shops and I bought...' (e.g. an apple).

Player 2 continues by saying the previous item (an apple) and then something new (e.g. some chocolate).

Continue the game, adding one more item to the end of the list each time.



Draw a picture of each item if you are finding it difficult to remember what has previously been mentioned.

Do you fancy having some 'Bake Off' fun? Why not try out these recipes. You will need an adult to help you.

Pitta Bread Pizza



Ingredients

- · 2 pitta breads
- 1 Tbsp tomato puree
- handful grated cheese
- · pizza toppings of your choice

Method

Heat oven to 180°C.

Place the pitta breads on a baking tray.

Spread tomato puree over each pitta.

Sprinkle over the cheese.

Add your pizza toppings.

Bake in the oven for 8 minutes.

Banana Oat Cookies



Ingredients

- · 2 ripe bananas
- · 80g oats
- ½ tsp vanilla extract
- · 20g desiccated coconut
- 30g chocolate chips

Method

Heat the oven to 180°C.

Put 10 muffin cups on a baking tray.

Peel the bananas, put them in a bowl and mash them with a fork.

Mix in the oats, vanilla extract, coconut and chocolate chips.

Scoop up balls of the mixture with a spoon and drop them into the muffin cups.

Squash them down in the cups with the back of the spoon.

Bake in the oven for 15 minutes.


Reading Challenges





Capital Letters



Have a go at making some capital letters of your own. You could make them with Lego, Playdough, K'Nex or maybe you would just like to draw out an alien alphabet like this one here!



Outdoor Spellings



Using chalk, draw out some boxes on the ground.

Write some letters inside the boxes. It is very important that you always include two vowels (the red letters) when you play this game and the rest can be blue.

- 1. Throw a bean-bag or other soft ball three times. Write down the letters that the bean bag lands on and see if you have made a word. (Clue: make sure you always land on one red letter.)
- 2. You can also try to jump on the letters in the right order to make a spelling. Be careful if there are any big jumps, you can always do steps instead.
 - 3. Try 4 or maybe even 5 beanbag throws to see if you can make a longer word you never know!


